All pupils should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them, This includes both academic and vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.	Every pupil should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a careers advisor who could be internal (a member of the school staff), or external, providing they are trained to an appropriate level. They should be available whenever significant study of career choices are being made. They should be expected for all pupils but should be timed to meet their individual needs.
